Urban Immersion Weekend at Bethel-Bethany UCC

Visiting youth open their eyes to issues that they may not have experienced in their communities, or more likely, had simply not noticed. The youth come away with an understanding of shared humanity with others who look differently from them, worship differently, and have different life circumstances. As they see how UCC Justice Ministries are seeking to alleviate social injustice, they leave with both a sense of hope, and a deeper understanding of their own faith and its connection to justice.

Visitors to Milwaukee experience diversity through a weekend of worship, service, food and cultural history. Participants have dinner in community with homeless Milwaukeeans at St. Ben's Community meal, worship with an African-American congregation at Greater Mt Sinai C.O.G.I.C., work on a service project, and visit the Islamic Society of Milwaukee to witness midday prayers. For fun and culture, they go to the Public Market downtown for lunch and later are the guests of Bethel-Bethany for a home-cooked soul food dinner.

In this time of sharply defined contrasts in our society, we have learned that connecting communities of people on a personal level increases our understanding of each other and reminds us that we are all brothers and sisters under one God. "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only love can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that."

After 30 years of working with UCC youth, we have also come away with a sense of hope and the belief that they are the light of our future.
